And CCF's Center for Financial Success worked with adults and families to ensure everyone had opportunities to develop job and financial literacy skills to improve their economic stability.


All of this critical work continues to be possible because of your dedication and we are beyond grateful for your support!





2019 FINANCIAL OVERVIEW



Bulldog Park has become an accessible community hub equipped with a safe and durable synthetic play surface and a variety of equipment to promote motor skill development, cooperative play, communication, and imagination.
